"Carouselle" and "The Tree" Compete in Play Festival
















This year Hilton High School held its First Annual One-Act Play Festival. Mooney submitted two plays: "Carouselle" and "The Tree".




Guidance

The Guidance department has expanded its services to both students and parents this year. A new sophomore testing program has been added. It is designed to give the counselor and student information concerning academic achievement, career decision-making and study skills information with a needs assessment. 
Resource Areas Expand Services



Library

The library is a busy place daily. It is a place for study and research before and during school hours. Instruction in library use is given at the freshman level and specialized reference materials are introduced at the upper levels. The reference section is strong and kept up-to-date and the periodical collection keeps students and staff abreast of many topics. The library also houses a coin operated copier for student and staff use.

Developing the Spiritual and the Physical



Theology

The Theology department has a two-fold mission. First, each student must demonstrate academic competency in certain fundamental concepts of the Roman Catholic faith. Secondly, each student must be challenged to grow and reflect on his/her faith commitment to Jesus. Through the knowledge and caring attitude of the faculty combined with the effort and respect of the students, this was a successful year for the good news of Jesus Christ.

Physical Education

Several major changes and additions were made in the Physical Education program this year. A new, fully matted room for wrestling, tumbling and aerobics was completed; two new storage areas for gym and athletic equipment were added, and the old, small lockers in the boys' locker room were replaced by newer, full-sized lockers. These projects have greatly enhanced the overall program and were made possible by both the generous donations of Mooney alumni and friends as well as by many hours of hard work by teachers, staff, parents, and students. The Physical Education curriculum was also expanded to include now a unit in indoor racquet sports.

The broad spectrum of the various genres in World Literature, American and English Literature as well as in Shakespearean drama is well covered.

Foreign Language

The Foreign Language department enriches students' cultural knowledge and offers them the experience of many languages. Offering French, Italian, Latin and Spanish, teachers stress communication and creativity. Students who qualify are inducted into their respective language honor societies. Participation in national language competitions is offered. The festivities of Foreign Language Week and sharing the activities of the International Club expand students' horizons and provide enjoyable experiences as well.


Stressing the Finer Elements in Life


Behind the Scenes They Keep Things Moving

It was performed for the school Christmas assembly and went on to become our winning entry in the first annual Monroe County High School One Act Play Competition. John Dudley was judged best supporting actor and the show took second place overall as the best production. It was scheduled to enter the Western New York High School Drama Festival at S.U.N.LY. 














