






DEDICATION

In 1937, when Bishop Kearney came to Rochester, most of the class of '61 were about as close to actualization as his fond dream of a men's college for Rochester. In his humble inaugural address, Bishop Kearney told the many members of his new diocese, who had come to welcome him, that he hoped his administration would be worthy of their reception. No one at that reception could have guessed the number or importance of the contributions their new bishop was going to make to the Diocese of Rochester.

In 1948, Bishop Kearney called upon the Basilian Fathers to establish in Rochester, a new Catholic college for men, to be called St. John Fisher College. He personally spearheaded a diocesan wide drive for funds for the new college and told his diocese that the erection of St. John Fisher College, "is the most important undertaking of my first ten years in this Diocese."

Fishermen are proud of the place they hold in the Bishop's heart and grateful to him for the continued interest he has shown in them and their school. In dedicating this tenth anniversary edition of Jo Roffs to Bishop James E. Kearney, we assume an important responsibility which the Very Reverend John Francis Murphy, former President of St. John Fisher College, ably expressed, when he said, "May Fishermen ever be worthy sons of our founder."

May God bless you in the vistas that now open.


