Artistic Company

GERALD RICHARDS (Father Tim Farley). Mr. Richards' most recent appearance was at Joseph Papp's Public Theatre in New York where he appeared in Mr. Bloom and the Cuclops, adapted from James Joyce's Ulusses, starring Siobhan McKenna. He was also seen last year at The Folger Shakespeare Library in Washington, D.C. as Prospero in The Tempest and at the Pennsylvania Stage Company in Allentown as the Policeman in Arthur Miller's The Price. Mr. Richards has appeared on Broadway with George C. Scott in General Seeger and in many Off-Broadway productions. Since his return from Europe after World War II Mr. Richards has appeared in "literally hundreds" of productions at regional theatres all over the United States, including a season at the nowdefunct Rochester Arena Theatre which was housed at the Hochstein Music School on Hoeltzer St.

TODD WARING (Mark Dolson) performed Mortimer in the New York Shakespeare Festival's production of Henry IV, Part 1, having earlier participated in their production of The Execution of Mary Stuart. Other New York credits include James Purdy's Wonderful Happy Days and the critically acclaimed performance of Mason in the Off-Off Broadway production of Journey's End, as well as the role of Skinner in Brian Friel's Freedom of the City.

Other recent credits include the role of Clifford Anderson in *Deathtrap*, opposite David McCallum in Birm-

ingham, Michigan.

On television Mr. Waring most recently appeared as Victor in "Fit for a King", an NBC pilot which aired last June. Previously, he appeared on "Nurse", "Another World", "Ryan's Hope" and "Search for Tomorrow", in

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
