Smoking Room and Gents' Parlor, Main Lobby, first door right.

Smoking positively forbidden in any part of the Lobbies of this Theater.

Check Room for cloaks, coats and umbrellas, in Lobby, left of Dress Circle Entrance.

Wet umbrellas not allowed in the Orchestra Circle, Orchestra or Balcony.

The Chairs of this Theater are equipped with the Colby Automatic Opera Glass Boxes, containing an Opera Glass, which can be rented to the occupant for one dime.

DIRECTIONS—A dime must be dropped in the box; then take the handle, which is suspended at your right arm. Press the handle in the keyhole and the box will open.

The Opera Glass must remain attached to the handle, and when not in use hang at your right.

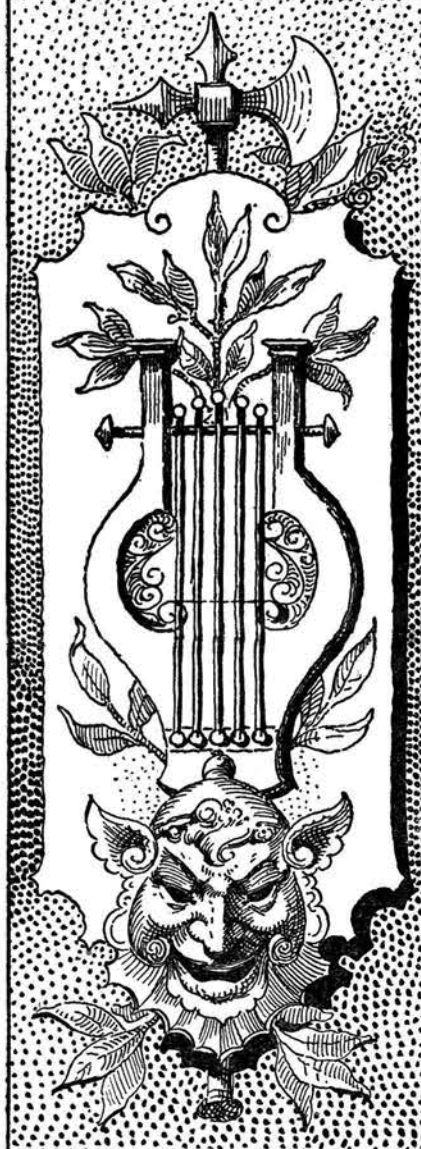
Patrons not having the required coin can obtain change from the usher.

Parties finding lost articles in any portion of the Theater will please leave them at the Box Office.

No fees of any kind allowed to ushers or attaches of this Theater.

Special attention is called to the safety of the Lyceum Theater. It is the only Theater in the city located on the ground floor, with exits on all four sides, provided with an asbestos curtain covering the entire proscenium, so that in case of fire on stage it would be impossible to communicate to auditorium. The Balcony and Gallery have iron stairs on both sides, leading to the walk, which, together with the Main Entrance built of iron and brick, will be opened at the close of each performance, or sooner, if necessary. The side doors in the Orchestra Circle will also be opened at the close of every performance.

The asbestos or fire curtain will be raised every evening upon the entrance of the orchestra. The stage is equipped with the sprinkler system, standpipes and coils of hose, connected directly with the Holly water service.

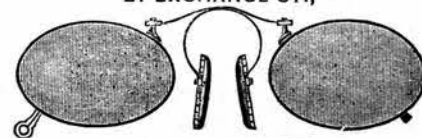

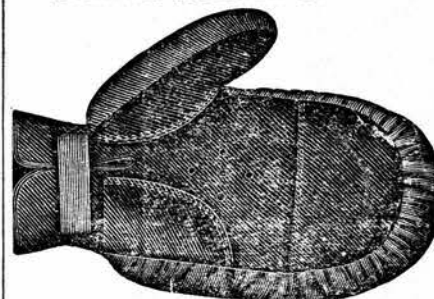
