THANKSGIVING WEEK

LeRoy, Talma & Bosco, Famous European Magicians, Headliners

One of the most pronounced hits of the current vaudeville season is being made by LeRoy, Talma & Bosco, the wonderful European magicians. In New York, Pittsburgh, Baltimore, Philadelphia and Boston they have been a profound sensation, admittedly the "last word" in mystery performances. Servais LeRoy has for years been conceded the greatest of all the world's magicians. LeRoy is a Belgian by birth, and as a little boy he did amazing feats of magic, increasing in skill as he gained in years. He never did the tricks of other magicians, but invented his own.

When the Belgium-Congo Expedition was organized by the late King Leopold, Servais LeRoy was an important member of it. His almost uncanny feats of illusion were startling to the natives of the Congo, and it was admitted that he accomplished more with his magic than the military corps did with guns and powder. Upon his return from this memorable trip, King Leopold decorated LeRoy. Then theater managers from all over Europe journeyed to Brussels to induce him to accept engagements. He finally made a tour of Europe, remaining one entire year in London and spending three years in the other cities of England.

Then LeRoy retired from public life with the fortune he had made and started a big factory in England for the manufacture of magicians' paraphernalia. This factory makes about ninety per cent. of the paraphernalia used by magicians.

Feats that have never been seen before, defying the solution of the keenest eyes and mind, are given in the act, and all accomplished with that mastery that has made Servais LeRoy the peer of all magicians. Mlle. Talma is an accomplished lady assistant, while Francisco Bosco is a funny man who creates no end of laughter to alternate with the astonishment caused by LeRoy.
