War Tax on Admission to Places of Amusement

Patrons Are Advised that Beginning Nov. 1, 1917, the Federal Law Makes it Obligatory for Them to Help Finance the War.

Title VII, Section 700.—That from and after the first day of November, 1917, there shall be levied, assessed, collected and paid, a tax of one cent for each ten cents or fraction thereof, of the amount paid for admission to any place of amusement, including admission by season ticket or subscription, *to be paid by the person paying such admission*; Provided, that the tax on admission of children under twelve years of age, where an admission charge for such children is made, shall in every case be one cent, and in the case of persons (except bona fide employees, municipal officers on official business, and children under twelve years of age) *admitted free* to any place at a time when and under circumstances under which an admission charge is made to other persons of the same class, *a tax of one cent for each ten cents or fraction thereof of the price so charged to such other persons for the same and similar accommodations to be paid by the person so admitted*, and a tax of one cent for each ten cents paid for admission to any public performance for profit, at any cabaret or other similar entertainment, to which the charge for admission is wholly or in part included in the price paid for refreshments, service or merchandise.
