

LUCILLE CAVANAGH

Lucille Cavanagh is Terpsichore re-incarnated. She is the twentieth century Goddess of the Dance. Her dancing is the combination of grace, beauty, agility and personality, carefully concealing perfect technique. Mr. Platt is also one of the stage's foremost directors and he has given infinite pains to perfect a medium for Miss Cavanagh's dancing expression.






