Veterans Bonus Bureau records show that he entered the service on February 14, 1941 by enlistment at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ohio. He was registered with a draft board, but the place and number are listed as unknown. His home address is listed as 105 Salem Street, Rochester, N.Y, the home of his parents, which was also his residence at the time of his death. He was listed as missing in action on November 8, 1942 and, under the provisions of Section 5, Public Law 490, 77th Congress, as amended, his death is presumed to have occurred on November 8, 1943. The official notification does not give the theater of operations where his death occurred, but his mother, has shown the place as Africa on her bonus claim. No other information is given regarding the veteran.

It stated also that mother rec'd word from WD. that his whereabouts was unknown after the Jap ship on which he was, was being transp. near the Philippines and was bombed. Was transp. to the Philippines as an infantryman in Oct. 1939 (TU). News item also states that his mother had not received his card written at the fall of Corregidor and Bataan until 18 mos. later. In Feb. 1945, D&C and TU reported that he was killed when the ship upon which he was being transported by the Japs was bombed and sunk on Sept. 6, 1944 near the Philippines. News items state that he enlisted in Aug. 1939 and was transf. to Manila in Oct. 1939 with the 31st Inf. Div.

DA (1942) gives very vague information regarding Eckhardt's whereabouts, except to say that he was in the Philippine Islands when it surrendered, and that his status at that time was "missing." States, further, that until it receives more definite information from Geneva, it cannot give any more definite information; consequently, it considers all those serving in the Philippines as "missing in action" from the time of the Corregidor's surrender on May 7, 1942, until positive information is forthcoming.

DA (1945) states that War Dept. has official list of prisoners which were on the Jap. freighter which was lost on Sept. 7, 1944, and states that Eckhardt was among those lost when it was sunk. Since all evidence shows that he was not a survivor, the Gov't concludes that he was killed in action on Sept. 7, 1944. Gives events leading to sinking: ship sailed from Davao, Mindanao on Aug. 20, 1944 with 750 prisoners of war, and on Sept. 7, 1944, off the western shores of Mindanao, it was sunk by torpedoes. All evidence shows that the prisoners had little opportunity to escape the sinking ship, and those who might have been survivors were killed by enemy gunfire. Jap. gov't reported all prisoners were lost, and on the basis of its own evidence, U.S. Gov't concludes that all unaccounted for prisoners were sunk at the time of the ship's sinking.

DA letter of Nov. 3, 1955 states the following: -

The records show that First Lieut. Willard B. Eddy, Jr., service number O 742 306, was killed in action Jan. 27, 1944, while serving as pilot of a B-25 (Mitchell) aircraft on a bombardment mission with the road junction at Velletri, Italy as the target. Lt. Eddy was flying in the left wing position of the second element. Shortly before the element started its bomb run over the target his plane received direct hits by enemy antiaircraft fire in the right engine nacelle and in the navigator's compartment. The plane left the formation falling in a series of slow rolls and spins and was observed to crash upside down in enemy controlled territory near Cisterna, Italy. Two individuals were observed to parachute from the plane and land behind enemy lines. Following the mission, Lt. Eddy was officially reported as missing in action as of Jan. 27, 1944. He was continued in a missing in action status for over twelve months, during which time no information concerning his whereabouts was received. On Apr. 16, 1945, in the absence of any evidence on which to base a continued presumption of his survival, his absence was terminated by an official finding of death, in accordance with the provisions of the Missing Persons Act. A report was subsequently received in the Department of the Army to the effect that your son's remains were recovered from an isolated grave near Cisterna, Italy, positively identified and reburied in the United States Military Cemetery at Nettuno, Italy. Based thereon, an official report of death was issued on Mar. 16, 1948 showing that First Lieutenant Willard B. Eddy, Jr., service number O 742 306, was killed in action on Jan. 27, 1944, the same date on which he was originally reported as missing.

Graves states that Eddy's mother reported he was listed as missing since Jan. ²⁷ 1944 and was presumed dead as of April 1945. The mother also states that he was shot down by anti-aircraft fire on his 39th mission while supporting the Anzio landing. He had participated in other missions over Greece, Yugo-slavia, Italy, and other enemy-held countries. Graves states that a news item by Henry W. Clune, quoting Eddy's schoolfellow, points out that he was pilot of a medium bomber, that he was nicknamed "Lightnin Eddy" and that the friend had named his plane after him. Graves also states his date of ~~active duty~~ was Aug. 4, 1941.

Army in January 1942, later transferring to A.C. Awarded wings in June 1943 after completing training at Douglas Air Field. Later report brought to light that he was killed in Apr. 1944 by the Nazis and a Belgian traitor. He was one of 8 American flyers so treated.

WD Letter dated 12-12-46 states that subsequent investigation has shown that the date on which the raid occurred and the men captured and killed was April 22, 1944. The records are, therefore, being changed to show that Lt. Eike was killed in action April 22, 1944. It had previously been reported that he died April 25, 1944 as a result of a German surprise raid on the underground camp where he was in hiding in the Chemay-St. Remy area, Belgium.

Remains found in unmarked grave at Gosselies, was disinterred, buried in U.S. Military Cemetery, Margraten, Holland, later returned to the U. S. for burial in Arlington National Cemetery.

Had arrived at bombing target, but was forced to leave the rest of the formation flying low owing to clouds, and in consequence, had been especially singled out by the enemy with searchlights and was subjected to very heavy fire. Nevertheless, their mission was accomplished and the pilot set out for home base, but on the way, two engines went out of control, and the plane lost altitude, and later, near Tchiang, Kweichow Province, China, order was given to bail out. Filer jumped, but because of the darkness, it was not possible to know whether or not his parachute was opened. Thorough search of this area proved fruitless. Consequently, since twelve months have elapsed and no sign of his whereabouts, Gov't. gives a presumptive finding of death, which is set as Dec. 11, 1945.

War Dept. letter dated May 14, 1946 states the following: An official report has now been received in the War Dept. that your son was killed in action when he was murdered by a Chinese while being escorted to safety after the crash of his airplane on Dec. 10, 1944. The place of your son's death was near Lan-Tsao-Wan, Kweichow Province, China (108° 20' east 28° 19' north). It is known that he parachuted from his plane, sustained a leg wound, and remained over night in the city of Teh-Kiang-hsien with a party of Chinese. When they reached Lan-sao-wan, about 11 miles n.e., only two Chinese remained with him. One of these men killed your son, but has not yet been apprehended. The other was a witness and has been taken into custody. The exact date of your son's death is not known, but in view of the circumstances, it is probable that it occurred about Dec. 13, 1944 and that date is reported as the official date of death.
